date" warning that it is time to add one of the prime events of the year to your shoot calendar.

The Connecticut Travelers travel along the Susquehanna River in Pennsylvania and upstate New York on September 28, 29 and 30, 2012.

Friday afternoon we visit an old friend, Rock Mountain Sporting Clays <http://rockmountainclays.com>. Many of us have been there before and know that the Rock is a shotgunner's paradise. It is considered to be one of the premier courses on the East Coast.


