What better way to soothe the IRS abrasions than to bust up lots of helpless but clever clay targets. No better place to do that than Ten Mile River Preserve and 127 Travelers agreed. The day dawned beautifully, sunny, COLD, and WINDY. No, I'm serious, it was really cold! Predicted, but nonetheless, challenging conditions. Great shuttle service got us all up the hill and Dean did a fine job of welcoming the crowd. After the traditional ceremonies, we headed for our stations, with the usual excitement/anticipation that precedes a great day of clays and friends.

The layout at Ten Mile is on a hillside which means many stations will be presented out over the valley. The rest are thrown against the hillside and those will usually be closer, more devious targets. This was generally true for the day. We started at 14 and Muller 1's served well for a long time with close, hittable, but technical targets. When we reached station 1, the character of the day took shape... excellent true pairs! From there out, any of the true pair presentations were hugely entertaining and challenging. Which bird first was never obvious and A or B was going to be well out of your comfort zone depending on your choice. Really nice job of setting those targets! Station 7 threw a tricky pair over the pond, and the pair at #10, "Western Skies" were just that. It's a funny feeling when you try A first and miss the pair, then you try B first, and miss again...that doesn't leave many options for the last pair. Aside from the simos, most agreed that the most challenging bird of the day was the B bird at #8. A was a fast but straightforward trap target, and B quartered away right to left and well below the stand. The terrain made it difficult to read the line, and taking it early seemed to be more successful. Of course, it was a four pair station.

As always, TMRP provided an excellent lunch, and a welcoming open bar.....always



a nice spot to re-live, re-assess, and re-spect the great targets. A wonderful day despite the chill and the wind, which did move things around. When Christian was asked how it went, he replied with his characteristic modesty and graciousness “Well, the wind got me on one of them” ... 99 ... you can’t get any closer to perfect than that!

I would like to thank Lans for providing the shoot write-up this month. It’s very refreshing to get a new perspective of the shoot. If anybody else ever has the desire... --Ed.

SO YOU WANT TO SHOOT FITASC?

If you shoot sporting clays long enough, eventually somebody will ask you if you shoot FITASC. At first you will just tell them that you have enough problems with regular sporting clays that you don’t need to add something like FITASC into the mix. Or maybe you look at them with a blank stare and give them a long drawn out “Nooooooo”, but you really mean “What the heck is FITSAC?”.

But then this FITASC thing eats at you. You Google FITASC and find out that FITASC stands for Fédération Internationale de Tir aux Armes Sportives de Chasse which is the name of the organization that writes the rules and organizes world championships. You read about it and do a little research and think maybe you'll try it. But then you get the entry form for the next big shoot and to shoot the FITASC it is 50% more than the main event. At this point you're thinking maybe next time.

Shooting FITASC has very similar elements to shooting regular sporting clays. There are quartering birds, crossing birds, rabbits, battaues, and chandelles. The main difference is how they are presented.

There are two styles of FITASC; "old style" and "new style". Most of the local tournaments focus on "old style" so that's what we will discuss today.

In Sporting Clays, you shoot three or four pair of the same targets at about fifteen stations. A typical FITASC course has four parcours. Each parcours is 25 targets and you shoot those 25 targets at three "pegs" or shooting positions. You are essentially shooting at 12 distinct places similar to stations.

Each peg will consist of singles and doubles. Each single is thrown from a different trap marked with a letter (A,B,C,D). The doubles are combinations of those four traps. For example, you will shoot singles from A, B, C, and D. Then you may shoot a report pair from A&B and then a true pair from D&C. Once your squad has completed the peg, the entire squad moves on to the next peg of the same parcours. The new peg may introduce a new trap, but the majority of the traps are reused. However, the new peg will give you a totally new presentation of each target. At one of the three pegs in each parcours you will shoot five singles and two pair. When your squad has completed all three pegs in the parcours, you move on to the next parcours.

Just as in regular sporting clays, each member of the squad gets to shoot first in round robin fashion. So this peg you shoot first and the next time you move to the back of the order. However, there is a little hitch in the rotation. As we said before, each peg consists of singles and doubles. Every member of the squad shoots the singles and then the first shooter goes to the end of the rotation to shoot doubles. The entire squad then cycles through the doubles. If there are six people in a squad, each person shoots first once per parcours.

When you get to the parcours, the order is already pre-determined by shoot management. As the first shooter, you will be calling for the view birds. The typical convention in this area is to see each target twice. The trapper will present you with the menu for each peg and the menu will be right in front of you. You will call for the



view birds in the order that they are on the menu. If the menu for the singles is A-B-C-D, you will call for A first. When you get a good look at A, you will say “may I see A again please” and the trapper will throw A on your call again. The sequence is repeated for B, C, and D and then you ask your squad if everybody is ready. Then the fun begins! You will shoot A, then B, C, and finally D and go to the back of the line. If you forget which target is coming next, you can look at the menu or ask the trapper. It’s only four or five targets to remember, not like five stand.

When you shoot FITASC singles, you are allowed full use of the gun. That means that you can take two shots at each single. If you chip the target with the first shot, you are not penalized by taking a second shot at the same target.

FITASC is a “low gun” sport. That means you can not pre-mount the gun to the shoulder. The gun is supposed to be 25cm (~10”) from the top of your shoulder. How do you know where 25cm is? No problem, the referee will put a chalk mark on your vest at the 25cm line memory.

If you have been thinking about trying FITASC, now is a great time to be a Connecticut Traveler. We are hosting a FITASC Championship of four “old style” parcours at Mid-Hudson on June 29th and 30th. You can shoot your targets either Saturday or Sunday. The best part is you can shoot FITASC for \$90. \$90? Yes, \$90! This is the perfect opportunity to experience FITASC for the same price as a normal shoot. See the shoot flyer in Reload! to sign up for this shoot. Travelers have first choice of their preferred start time until May 27th and then we’re opening it up to the world. The Saturday afternoon slot is very popular.

Next month we will discuss some of the differences in rules between FITASC and regular sporting.
